The Cavagna Award

The first annual Cavagna Award is in the books and was a huge success. Our first attempt for the presentation was well received by all who were present.

Outgoing President Bob Bauer did a wonderful job reading the requirements for the eligibility to receive this award, after which he explained how and why this award had come about. Bob listed some of the contributions that John and Joan had given to the Show-Me Corvair Club and CORSA since they joined in 1979, including their time and expertise.

Bob then began naming the many ways that our recipient had earned this award.

As Trevor Monninger listened, his face started to show astonishment that the

things being said sounded pretty familiar. Finally, he heard his name being called as the recipient of the first Cavagna Award.

Trevor has helped our members by sharing his time and knowledge with anyone who asked. Trevor also has been a very active participant in CORSA annual conventions, promoting our club and the Corvair. Trevor has won numerous awards and accolades each year at CORSA conventions. This year, he won second place in the concours and took the "Gold Elevated to Senior" award by scoring 97.78 points with the 1963 Spyder convertible which he helped John to restore. Trevor uses his Cor-



vairs as daily drivers and has probably put more miles on his Corvair each year than all of the rest of our members combined, except maybe John Carter, who drives from Tulsa, Oklahoma, and back.

Next, Bob read a copy of the recommendation that John and Joan had submitted to the Corvair Preservation Foundation a few years ago in Trevor's behalf to be considered for the Frank Winchell Memorial Scholarship that they offer to younger members. Trevor won the scholarship that he so deservedly earned.

President Bauer shared a few experiences that he had with our Cavagna award winner. He mentioned how much Trevor has impressed him with the speed and accuracy of detecting and fixing problems with Corvair engines and other mechanical issues. After all of the

deserving accolades, Trevor went up and accepted the first annual Cavagna Award.

Trevor along with his family have sponsored some of our tech sessions at their house. I probably have been the most fortunate member of the club, being not so mechanically inclined. At one of the tech sessions hosted by the Monninger's, Trevor had me bring my car a few days early. He let me drive his personal Monza convertible back to my house to keep in my garage, making room for my car in his garage. He worked on my car and then, the day of the tech session, he was instrumental in helping our many other gurus drop the engine and replace the main motor mounts and rear engine seal. He kept my car after the tech session and installed the rubber seal around the engine compartment and put larger jets in my carburetors. I think he did even more, but I do not know the technical terminology.



The recipient of the first Cayagna Award enjoyed a special relationship with John and Joan. Trevor was very supportive of the Cavagna's during their declining years. He continued his dedication to the Cavagna family after Joan and John had passed by assisting the family during their bereavement.

John and Joan's children Debbie, Glen, and Suzanne, along with their spouses, attended as our special guests, making the event that much more special. Suzanne surprised and delighted us by offering her services as our next club Secretary. Her offer was graciously accepted, putting a big smile on Rose Bauer's face and a sigh of relief. Having Suzanne as our Secretary means that a precious part of John and Joan will be involved and appreciated by the Show Me Corvair Club.

Experiencing this presentation in person made me feel grateful for having been chosen, along with Tom James and Don Hemwall, to be on the committee to plan and instigate the birth of such a prestigious award, honoring two of our long time and dedicated members, John and Joan Cavagna. They will live long in the hearts and minds of anyone that was fortunate enough to have known them.
