January 27, 2024 Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President Goddard at the Jefferson Underground, followed by the pledge of allegiance.

The following were present: Kent Goddard, Ron Karl, Tom Yengel, Jim Koch, Don Hogan, Nick Raeber, Mike Hall, Chris Hall, Ken Pick, Tom James, Mike Kost, David Wilson, Suzanne Cavagna, John Mackiewicz, Mark Moyer, Jack Holahan, Kurt Arthur, and Carl Briggs. Two prospective new members, Gene Buescher and Charlie Geiler were also present. President Goddard thanked all the those in attendance. He also thanked our past and current officers and committee leaders. A special thanks was given to John Carter for our new meeting space at the Underground. President Goddard invited those present to give a brief self-introduction. He also asked if everyone was okay with having a brief social time before the general meetings and starting the meetings at 10:15- everyone was okay with this suggestion.

There was a brief December meeting at the Christmas party. A motion was made by Kurt Arthur seconded by Mark Moyer to approve the minutes from December 9, 2023. The motion passed unanimously.

Reports:

Treasurer Carl Briggs gave the December monthly report. A motion was made by John Mackiewicz, seconded by Tom Yengel to approve the report as read. The motion passed unanimously. Copies of this report are available to club members upon request.

There was discussion about whether the monthly treasurer reports should be posted to the members only section of the website. It was decided this would not be done. A motion was made by Kurt Arthur and seconded by Mike Hall that a note would be put in every newsletter to contact the treasurer for more information or to obtain a copy of the treasurer's report. The motion passed unanimously.

Historian Tom James reported he has 4-5 boxes of duplicate publications. He has archived the best copies and invited those present to offer ideas for what to do with the duplicates. A motion was made by Kent Goddard and seconded by Don Hogan-

that a full set of publications would be kept at Tom James' home;
that Tom James would email to the club members that duplicates are available free to club members but if they needed to be mailed the member would pay for postage;
and that the remaining duplicated would be brought to the Underground, sorted and a set kept in the club's meeting room. Any others would be recycled.

The motion passed unanimously.

Membership chairmen Trevor Monninger was not able to be at the meeting. In his absence, President Goddard reported two prospective members were in attendance for the meeting and he invited them to see Carl for membership information.

Old Business:

Clausius' car needs to be removed from the Underground by the end of May. There was an in-depth discussion on what options are available:

Restore the car and sell it- there are concerns about the title, manpower to complete the work, and whether there is profit in it for SMCC.

Sell it as a parts car to a club member (1st option, closed bids) or a 3rd party.

Part it out ourselves at the Underground – club member labor required; John said we could store the parts on shelving at the Underground.

Various options were discussed, with the consensus being to put the car up for auction to club members as a parts car without a title. If no buyer was interested, then an alternate approach will be discussed and voted on at a future meeting.

There was a motion made by Mark Moyer to offer the car as a parts car to club members via a closed bid to President Goddard, with a minimum bid of \$600, the motion was seconded by Ken Pick. The motion passed unanimously. Ron Karl will take pictures of the car and parts, and work with Kurt Arthur to post an article for club members regarding the bidding process.

Tom James reported that a proposal was presented to the Board for amendments to the Bylaws and Charge Document regarding the Cavagna award. These will be presented to the general club at a future meeting. A vote will also need to be made to determine if a permanent committee needs to be implemented and if there should be limitations set on if a member can win the award more than one year in a row or more than once. An article about the presentation of the award in December will be sent to Corsa for publication.

Carl Briggs asked about the President's Award for Past President Bob Bauer, and Past Secretary Rose Bauer. A discussion will be had at the next general meeting what should be done for past officers.

New Business:

A discussion was had at the recent Board meeting regarding the 2024 recommended bereavement donation amount. The Board recommended \$100 to be spent as directed by the Bylaws for anyone who qualifies. A motion was made by David Wilson and seconded by Carl Briggs to set the 2024 bereavement donation at \$100. The motion passed unanimously. Club member Richard Boxdorfer recently passed away in December. There were two possible recipients listed in his memorial- Hospice of Southern Illinois and/or the Meadowbrook Fire Department. A motion was made by Mark Moyer to make the \$100 bereavement donation to the Meadowbrook Fire Department and seconded by Ron Karl. The motion passed unanimously.

If there are situations in the future where choices need to be made regarding bereavement donations, they will be handled by the Board.

The Cavagna family presented the club with a \$250 donation at the Christmas Party. The Board recommended depositing it in the SMCC general fund. A motion was made by Mark Moyer and seconded by Kurt Arthur. The motion passed unanimously.

The 2024 list of potential activities was briefly discussed, with a further discussion tabled for the next meeting. President Goddard said there needs to be a coordinator for each event. Nick Raeber suggested having a Tech Tip at the end of the meetings, where some kind of tip could be shared. For the February meeting it was recommended to have a tech session afterwards on how to rebuild a carburetor.

A discussion was had regarding the City's St. Patrick's Day Parade. There was not enough interest to proceed with it for 2024.

A motion was made by Mark Moyer and seconded by Nick Raeber to adjourn. The motion passed unanimously.
