Charley Geiler—Member Profile

I own a 63 Monza 2Dr with a 110 motor and PG trans. I bought it because I had some money saved up and was looking for a project. I considered several options but really wanted something unique and odd-ball. I remembered that my dad had owned a (non running) EM Corvair when I was a child and they certainly fit the "unique" category. So I went looking and found the one I have today.

The guy I bought it from had worked on it a bit but was not the best mechanic. Among other things, he



thought it was a positive ground system and had been running the car with the battery connected backwards! Apparently the starter doesn't care which way the battery is connected. It will still crank the motor over in the right direction. And since there's really no electronics to speak of, the motor will run happily (for a while at least) with the battery backwards! He couldn't get it to start when I went to look at it, but the body was pretty solid, the car was pretty complete, and the price was where I wanted to be, so I took it home.



I've been slowly going over the car from nose to tail and to date it has a freshly rebuilt 110 motor, PG, generator, and starter. New brake lines, tie rod ends, cleaned gas tank and a host of other small stuff that I'm forgetting. I try to drive it every weekend. Old cars don't like to sit for too long. I've never tossed a fan belt but I have had one roll over in the groove. Future plans include some basic interior work and electronic ignition. I get asked about the wheels a lot. So in case you're wondering,

they're 17x7 + 35mm offset with 5mm spacers wrapped in 215/45 rubber. Yes they will rub if you're at full lock and hit a bump (like dropping out of a parking lot)

The thing I like the most about this car is that it's a guaranteed conversation starter. It seems like everybody over a certain age either had one, learned to drive on one, or had a neighbor that owned one. While everybody under a certain age has no idea what it is. Either way, folks always want to talk about it.

The worst Corvair job has got to be wrestling the gas tank in and out. The clamp on the filler tube hose is im-

possible to reach at any angle! My forearm was all scratched up for a week! A close second is trying to get the thermostat rods hooked onto the damper doors.

I love cab-overs and wagons (I've owned both), so my dream Corvair would be either a Greenbrier or a Lakewood. Although the Rampsides are pretty cool too!

I've owned many different cars over the years, I don't know how many would be considered "classics" but the ones that stand out to me are a 74 Datsun 260Z with some motor work done. That thing was an absolute rocket!

The 68 Ford Country squire wagon stands out too. I was in a rock band in high school and that car held all of

us plus all our equipment and never broke a sweat.

Then there was the 71 VW bus. I never could get it to run more than 20 minutes without overheating!

Best car memory. I was in my early 20's driving home from work in



my 88 Honda Prelude. It was a warm summer night, my favorite band playing on the radio, windows down, the sound of the wind rushing over the open

sun roof. It was this moment where everything just seemed to perfectly align in my life. And I remember wishing that every night could be that ideal. That's probably the car I'd want back too. Not

because it's the most exciting, but because it was the perfect car at the perfect time.

If I could have any car, it would probably be another Datsun Z car with a well-built (but era correct) motor and trans. The 260 I had was a lot of fun and as much as I love 60's Detroit iron, there's something really magical about those early Japanese models. A close second would be another wagon. Maybe an early 70's Olds Vista Cruiser. And yes, I've liked that model even before "That 70's Show" made it popular!

Other hobbies include electronics design/repair/modifications and woodworking. I play electric guitar and bass (and saxophone). I also run a side gig where I specialize in fixing obsolete/forgotten technology. Like vacuum tube based equipment, or 70s-80s era computers, pinball, arcade machines, etc.
